

NCCP COURSES DELIVERED BY CURL ONTARIO

There are three parts to each of NCCP Level 1, Level 2 and Level 3. They are TECHNICAL, THEORY, and PRACTICAL. All three parts for every Level must be completed in order to become NCCP Certified at that Level. (a coach needs to be a minimum Level 1 Certified to coach a team at an OCA Regional and/or Provincial Level).

TECHNICAL

Level 1 Technical and Level 2 Technical are each 2-day classroom/on-ice courses. Several of these are offered each season by Curl Ontario and details may be found on the Curl Ontario website www.curlontario.com

Level 3 Technical is an in-depth 2 1/2 day course on-ice and classroom.

THEORY

Details about the Theory courses may be found on the Curl Ontario website, under **NCCP THEORY COURSES**. There is a link there to the Coaches Association of Ontario website which is responsible for all the Theory Courses in Ontario.

Theory Level 1 is now referred to as "Introduction to Competition, Part A"

Theory Level 2 is now referred to as "Introduction to Competition, Part B"

Theory Level 3 is called just that.

"Introduction to Competition, Parts A and B" are both two-day in-class courses.

Level 3 Theory is a multi-day course and includes a major assignment.

PRACTICAL

Level 1 PRACTICAL is a relatively simple form to be completed listing a minimum of 20 hours of coaching and/or instructing experience. The practical experience must start after completion of the Level 1 Technical course. The PRACTICAL form is part of the materials given out at the Level 1 Course. When complete PRACTICAL forms should be forwarded to the Curl Ontario office. (address on website masthead)

Level 2 PRACTICAL and 3 PRACTICAL are more in-depth forms, and are distributed at the time of the TECHNICAL courses.

Level 2 requires completion of the workbook as well as the following:

The coach must have coached for a minimum of 40 hours and 10 hours instruction to an intermediate/advanced skill level team,

OR

The coach must have coached for a minimum of 60 hours to an intermediate/advanced skill level team.

Level 3 Practical must acquire a total of 3 points in a variety of ways described on the form.

PREREQUISITES

LEVEL 1 Technical. There is no prerequisite.

LEVEL 2 Technical. The coach must have completed Level 1 Technical and Level 1 Practical.

LEVEL 3 Technical. The coach must be fully Certified Level 2 to be eligible to take the Level 3 Technical.

NOTES

Coaches must be a minimum of 16 years of age on the day of any course.
Coaches may claim a maximum of 1 hour of coaching when watching their team play a game.

Practical forms must be completed on the computer or in pen. (using a pencil is not acceptable to complete any form)

Club Coach – Youth (formerly called Kidscurl)

The NCCP Club Coach - Youth Course is a one-day on-ice/classroom course and is recommended for individuals working with the Little Rock and/or Bantam age groups. Program coordinators, volunteers and parents are encouraged to take this course. There is no prerequisite.
